



I was disappointed when I looked at Graph 1 and realized that the voting rate of young people in Japan is so low, especially in the last ten years. I think

everyone should vote and I am looking forward to doing so in the future.

According to Graph 2, most young people said that they were not interested in voting. I'm surprised that they said this because I think the decisions made by the government affect all of our lives. Other people mentioned that they were busy working and unable to vote. I know that many people work long hours, but voting booths are open from morning to evening. Also, you can even vote before election day.

I think that young people should understand the connection between politics and things that are important to us in our lives such as having a job, bringing up children and healthcare. 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Looking at Graph 1, I was not surprised that the situation in Japan is similar to that in Britain. In both countries, many young people don't vote.

Some of the reasons are given in Graph 2. Almost 20% of people under 30 said that they were not satisfied with any of the candidates. I sometimes feel this way as well. Also, many young people said that they don't understand politics, so perhaps they didn't feel able to vote. I can understand this way of thinking. We often hear adults talking about political issues. This means that some people may believe that politics is only understood by older people.

I think that the voting rate will only increase if students are educated about politics in school. There is a link between politicians' decisions and our taxes, schools and public transport. Knowing this, I think young people would want to vote, even if there is no perfect candidate. Politics can be taught in an interesting manner such as by having a mock election. In this way, young people can learn about different parties and how they think about important issues. I will suggest this to my classmates and teachers.
